EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

For the month of March, the FBMKLCI Index closed lower by -1.0% MoM to 1,536.07 points, ceased the five consecutive months of gains. The average daily trading value in the month rose 7.5% MoM and 42.4% YoY to RM2.9bil. Meanwhile, average daily trading volume in March rose 12.2% MoM and 24.7% YoY to 3.9bil units.

Malaysia Government Securities (“MGS”) yields were largely unchanged. Brent crude oil prices continued to close higher at USD87.48/barrel as at end-Mar’24 (end-Feb’24: USD83.62/barrel), mainly due to the intensified tension in the Middle East region. Meanwhile, Ringgit strengthened against the Dollar to RM4.7250/USD as at end-Mar’24 (end-Feb’24: RM4.7428/USD)

On the local economic data, Malaysia inflation edged higher by +1.8% YoY in Feb’24 (Jan’24: +1.5% YoY).

For the equity market, we expect a positive recovery in the year 2024, especially for the local market, supported by improved corporate earnings and government transformation plans that should support the domestic economy. We expect BNM to maintain the OPR unchanged at least for the first half of 2024, due to easing inflation expectation. On the global economic review, the resilience of the US economy may lead to a soft landing, rather than recession. The tail-end of global monetary policy tightening will be positive for foreign investors to make their way back to the local stock market.

Meanwhile for fixed income, after series of OPR hikes to pre-pandemic level, BNM is anticipated to keep its monetary policy unchanged in 1H2024, aiming to balance the economic growth and inflationary pressure in the country. The external risk factors such as Israel-Hamas war and Russia-Ukraine geopolitical tension will continue to weigh on the local market, but we believe corporate bond space still provides attractive yields. As such, our fixed income strategy will remain defensive to shelter from the market volatilities in the near term.

Based on the table below, monthly, most of the funds have outperformed the benchmark indices except for MCIS Life Global Yakin Fund and MCIS Life Jati Fund.

Policyholders are encouraged to focus on regular premiums given the current risk and volatile period of the economic and market condition. Risk-averse investors should focus on income funds due to its less volatile as compared to equity-related funds.

MCIS Life AsiaPac Fund Monthly Report (March 2024)

Investment Objective

To achieve a steady income stream with potential growth in the Asia Pacific Region over the medium to long term. The aim of the Fund is to outperform the S&P Ethical Pan Asia Select Dividend Opportunities Index over periods of five or more years.

Investment Strategy

To invest in Principal S&P Asia Pacific Ethical Dividend Exchange Traded Fund (ETF), managed by Principal Asset Management (S) Pte Ltd where the ETF is listed on the Singapore Stock Exchange.

The ETF focuses on the top 40 ethical and high-yielding stocks in the Asia Pacific Region excluding India, Taiwan, Japan, New Zealand, and the Philippines. The fund provides country diversification across the industry that is traded in US Dollars.

The Fund is considered low risk given the exposure to only one underlying securities with no attempt to select stocks individually or to take defensive positions in declining markets. Risk is managed at the management level, where the asset allocation of the fund is to be reviewed on a regular basis and adjusted to be commensurate with the Investment Team's view on the relative attractiveness of each asset class.

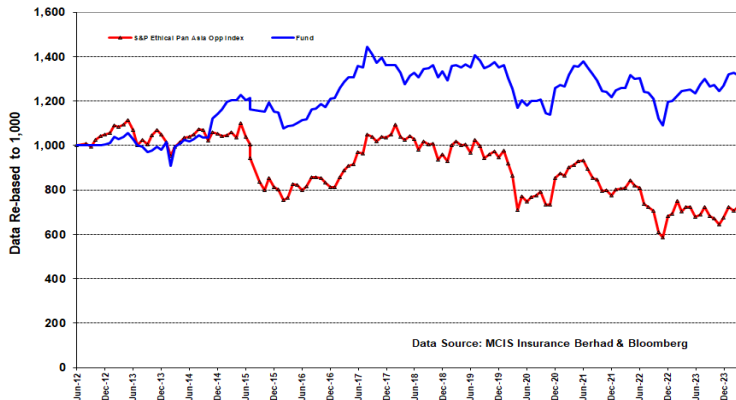

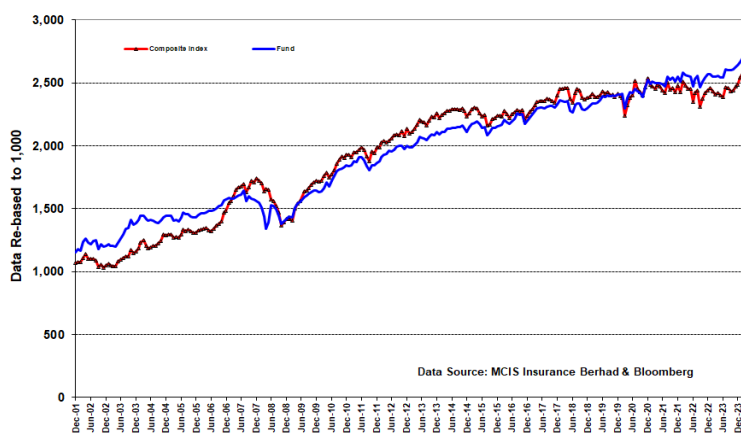

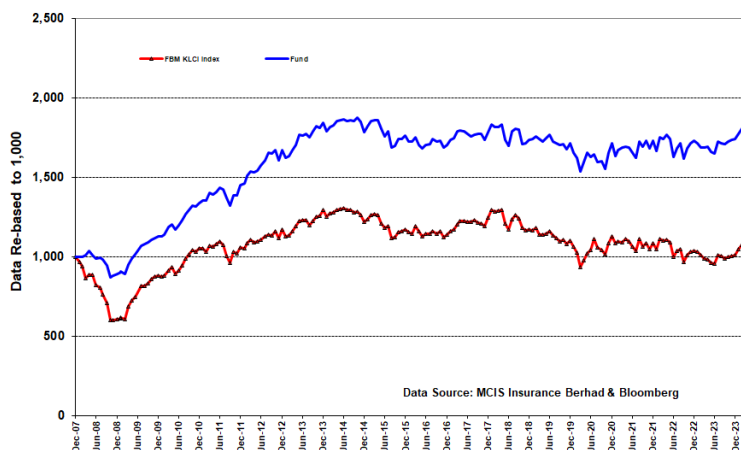

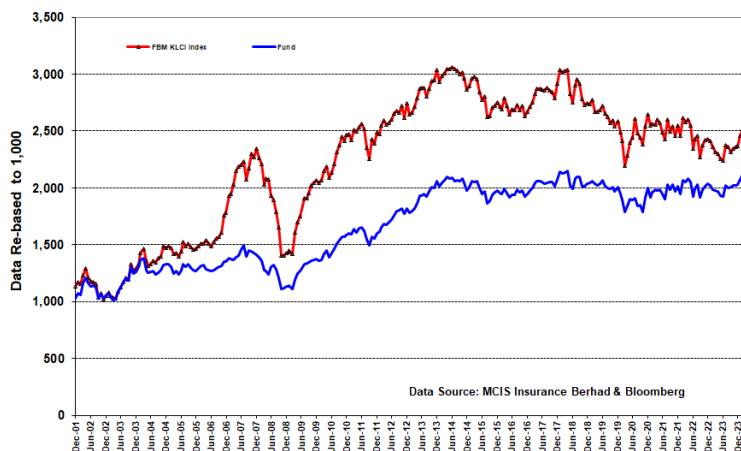

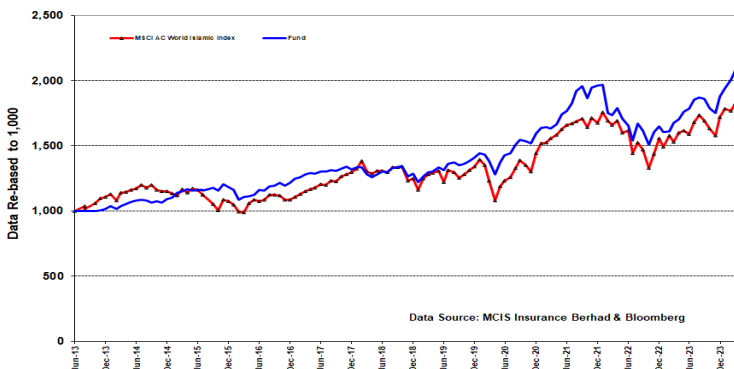

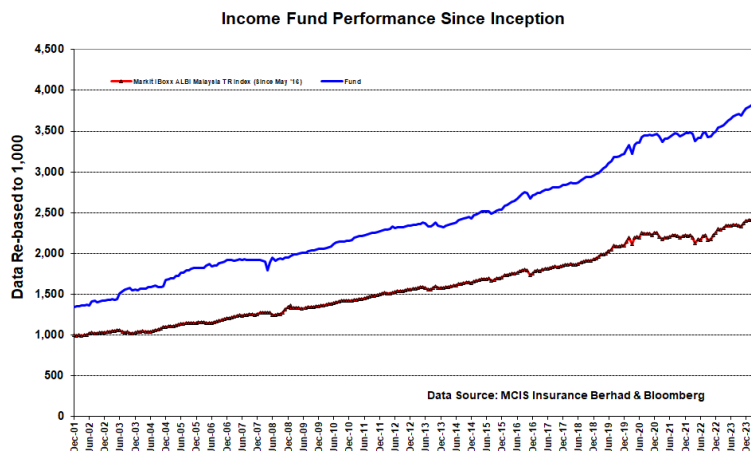

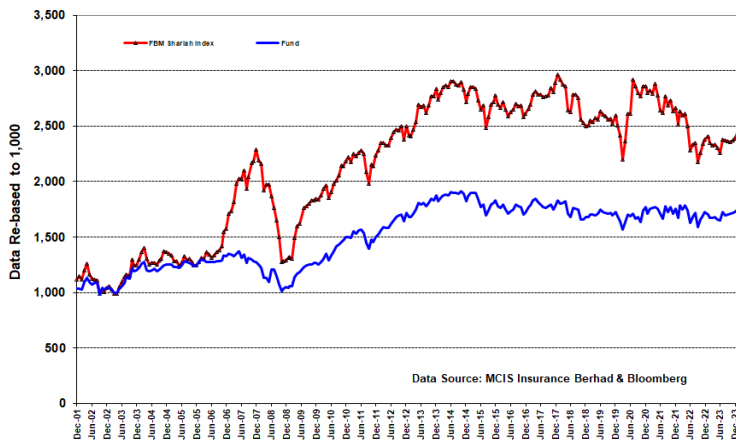

Investment Objective

The Fund invests in EQ8 DOW JONES US TITANS 50 ETF (“EQ8US50”) (formerly known as MyETF Dow Jones U.S. Titans 50) which aims to provide investment results that closely correspond to the performance of the Dow Jones Islamic Market U.S. Titans 50 Index. The Fund is not a Shariah-compliant product.

Investment Strategy

EQ8US50 is managed by Eq8 Capital Sdn Bhd (formerly known as i-VCAP Management Sdn Bhd) and it invests in 50 largest Shariah-compliant companies listed in the U.S. EQ8US50 is a passively managed fund.

Risks

The Fund is considered low risk given the exposure to only one underlying securities with no attempt to select stocks individually or to take defensive positions in declining markets. Risk is managed at the management level, where the asset allocation of the fund is to be reviewed on a regular basis and adjusted to be commensurate with the Investment Team’s view on the relative attractiveness of each asset class.

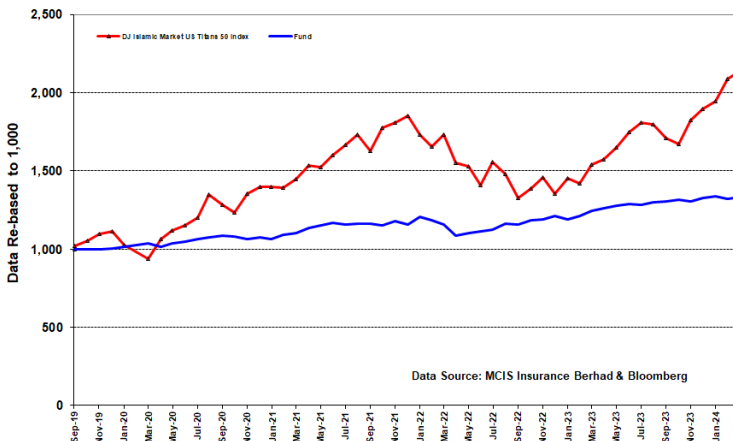

Equity Market Review and Outlook

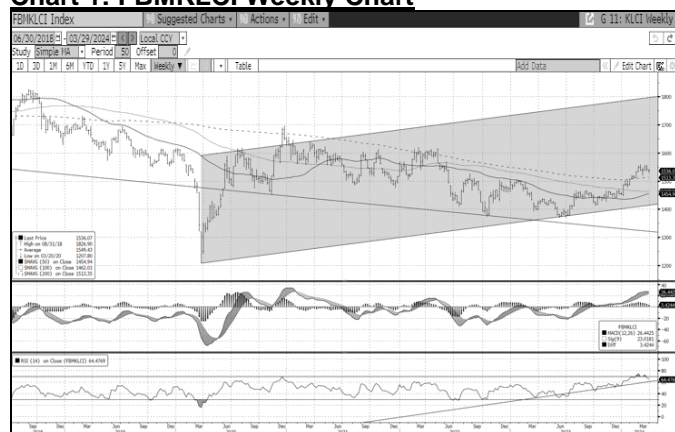
Market Review

For the month of March 2024, the FBMKLCI Index closed lower by -1.0% MoM to 1,536.07 points, ceased the five consecutive months of gains. The average daily trading value in the month rose 7.5% MoM and 42.4% YoY to RM2.9bil. Meanwhile, average daily trading volume in March rose 12.2% MoM and 24.7% YoY to 3.9bil units.

Local institutions recorded a net buy of RM3.5bil in March (compared to a net sell flow of RM721.4mil in the previous month). Foreign investors snapped a four-month streak of net buying and turned net sellers in March with net sell flows of RM2.9bil (compared to net buy flow of RM1.3bil in February). Foreign investors' net sell flows in March erased the cumulative net buy flows from the first two months of 2024, which resulted in a cumulative net foreign outflow of RM0.9bil in the 1Q24 and a total outflow of RM35.3bil since 2010. Local retail investors recorded a net sell of RM292.3mil in March, which decreased by 17.5% on MoM basis. The month of March 2024 also marked the ninth consecutive month of net selling by local retail investors.

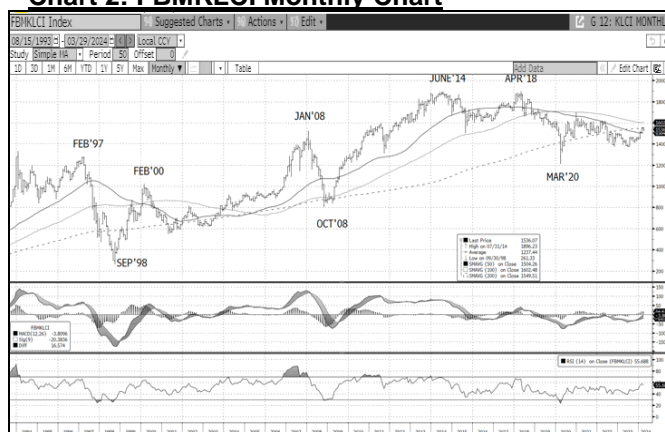
Meanwhile, global equity markets continued their positive momentum in March, supported by stable economy and lower inflation which resulted in positive corporate earnings and rate cuts. In the U.S., Dow Jones Industrial Index closed higher by 2.1% MoM and the broader S&P 500 index closed higher by 3.1% MoM. Meanwhile, eurozone shares also posted a gain with Bloomberg European 500 index closed 3.6% MoM higher. In Asia, the performances were mostly positive. MSCI Asia APEX 50 ex-Japan closed higher by 4.9% MoM during the period under review.

Market Outlook & Strategy

Traditionally, FBMKLCI Index's performance was positive in April, with an average of 2.0% and 0.6% for MoM returns over the past 10 years and 45 years. We expect the market to be supported by its attractive valuations at current levels of 1.36x as it is now below its 13-year historical average of P/B (1.34x) and 15.2x PER compared to the 13-year historical average of PER (17.1x).

Technically, the FBMKLCI Index has been rebounding higher since it broke the 22-months downtrend line from the March 2022 highs. It is currently trading above its 20-day, 50-day, and 200-day simple moving averages (SMAs), implying an ongoing positive sentiment. The immediate support level is seen at the resistance-turned-support of 1,500 psychological mark, followed by 1,465. On the upside, we are eyeing the 1,530 and 1,570 resistances. Meanwhile, the longer-term resistance is set at the 1,600-round figure.

We expect a positive recovery in 2024, especially for the local market, supported by improved corporate earnings and government transformation plans that should support the domestic economy. We expect BNM to maintain the OPR unchanged at least for the first half of 2024, due to easing inflation expectation. On the global economic review, the resilience of the US economy may lead to a soft landing, rather than recession. The tail-end of global monetary policy tightening will be positive for foreign investors to make their way back to the local stock market.

Fixed Income Review and Outlook

Market Review

Malaysia Government Securities (“MGS”) yields were largely unchanged. Brent crude oil prices continued to close higher at USD87.48/barrel as at end-Mar’24 (end-Feb’24: USD83.62/barrel), mainly due to the intensified tension in the Middle East region. Meanwhile, Ringgit strengthened against the Dollar to rM4.7250/USD as at end-Mar’24 (end-Feb’24: RM4.7428/USD)

On the local economic data, Malaysia inflation edged up higher by +1.8% YoY in Feb’24 (Jan’24: +1.5% YoY). The higher cost was driven by Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas & Other Fuels (HWEGOF) which rose +2.7% YoY (Jan’24: +2.0% YoY), reflecting the water tariff hike starting in Feb’24. Headline inflation is expected to increase further in Mar’24, taking cue from Sales & Service Tax hike (6% to 8% in Mar’24). Malaysia Exports growth was muted (Feb’24: -0.8% YoY; Jan’24: +8.7% YoY), reflecting the calendar effect of Chinese New Year holidays on top of the short month of February, while Imports growth eased to +8.4% YoY in Feb’24 (Jan’24: +18.7% YoY). For the Exports growth, the decline in Manufacturing Exports and Agriculture Exports was offset by the strong expansion in Mining Exports. Imports saw double-digit growth in all segments, with Capital Imports at +30.3% YoY (Jan’24: +41.5% YoY), Consumption Imports at +19.7% YoY (Jan’24: +25.3% YoY) and Intermediate Imports at +14.3% YoY (Jan’24: +21.3% YoY). In summary, trade surplus rose slightly to +RM10.9 billion (Jan’24: +RM10.2 billion).

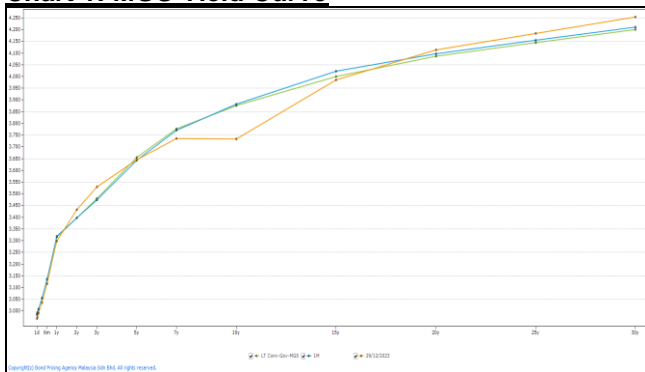
BNM’s international reserve continued to decline, coming in at USD113.8 billion as at end-Mar’24 (end-Feb’24: USD114.3 billion). The reserve is sufficient to finance 5.6 months of retained imports and is 1.0 time of short-term external debts.

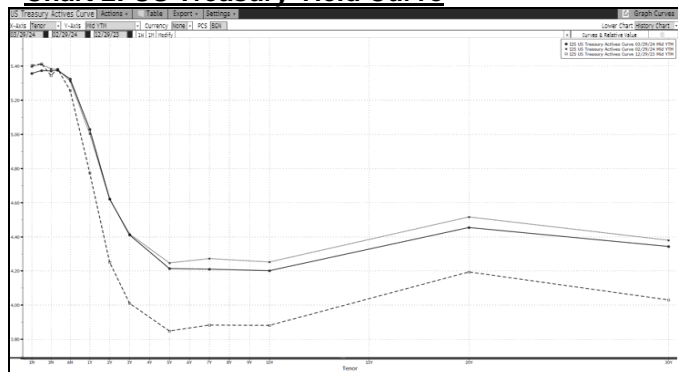

US 10-year Treasury yield dropped slightly to 4.20% as at end-Mar’24 (end-Feb’24: 4.25%), reflecting the market expectation of multiple US Fed rate cuts in the year.

Market Outlook & Strategy

After a series of recent OPR hikes to pre-pandemic level, BNM is anticipated to keep its monetary policy unchanged in 2024, aiming to balance the economic growth and inflationary pressure in the country. The external risk factors such as Israel-Hamas war and Russia-Ukraine geopolitical tension will continue to weigh on the local market, but we believe corporate bond space still provides attractive yields. As such, our fixed income strategy will remain defensive to shelter from the market volatilities in the near term.
