EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

For the month ending October 2024, the FBMKLCI closed lower to 1,601.88 points (-2.9% MoM and +10.1% YTD). The index remained volatile in the short term given lack of catalyst, as the market reacted neutrally to the Budget 2025 announcement. The investors also hold back their position ahead of the US presidential election. The average daily trading value on Bursa fell 24.7% MoM and +26.2% YoY to RM2.5bil. Meanwhile, the average daily trading volume fell 12.6% MoM and -9.1% YoY to 2.8bil units.

Malaysia Government Securities (“MGS”) yields surged higher, in line with the increasing US Treasury yields. Brent crude oil prices rose to USD73.16/barrel as at end-Oct’24 (end-Sep’24: USD71.77/barrel), reflecting the further escalation of geopolitical tension in Middle East. Meanwhile, ringgit tumbled to RM4.3780/USD in Oct’24 (Sep’24: USD4.1235/USD).

On the local economic data, the inflation inched slightly lower to +1.8% YoY in Sep’24 (Aug’24: +1.9% YoY) on the back of easing transport cost due to the lower global crude oil prices.

For the equity market, we expect a positive recovery in 2024, especially for the local market, supported by improved corporate earnings and government transformation plans that should support the domestic economy. We expect BNM to maintain the OPR unchanged throughout the year 2024, due to easing inflation expectations. On the global economic review, the resilience of the US economy may lead to a soft landing, rather than recession. The tail-end of global monetary policy tightening will be positive for foreign investors to make their way back to the local stock market.

Meanwhile for fixed income, after a series of recent OPR hikes to pre-pandemic level, BNM is anticipated to keep its monetary policy unchanged in 2024, aiming to balance the economic growth and inflationary pressure in the country. The external risk factors such as Middle East and Russia-Ukraine geopolitical tensions will continue to weigh on the local market, but we believe corporate bond space still provides attractive yields. As such, our fixed income strategy will remain defensive to shelter from the market volatilities in the near term.

Based on the table below, on monthly basis, most of the local funds outperformed their respective benchmarks, except for MCIS Life Jati Fund.

Policyholders are encouraged to focus on regular premiums given the current risk and volatile period of the economic and market condition. Risk-averse investors should focus on income funds due to its less volatile as compared to equity-related funds.

MCIS Life AsiaPac Fund Monthly Report (October 2024)

Investment Objective

To achieve a steady income stream with potential growth in the Asia Pacific Region over the medium to long term. The aim of the Fund is to outperform the S&P Ethical Pan Asia Select Dividend Opportunities Index over periods of five or more years.

Investment Strategy

To invest in Principal S&P Asia Pacific Ethical Dividend Exchange Traded Fund (ETF), managed by Principal Asset Management (S) Pte Ltd where the ETF is listed on the Singapore Stock Exchange.

The ETF focuses on the top 40 ethical and high-yielding stocks in the Asia Pacific Region excluding India, Taiwan, Japan, New Zealand, and the Philippines. The fund provides country diversification across the industry that is traded in US Dollars.

Risks

The Fund is considered low risk given the exposure to only one underlying securities with no attempt to select stocks individually or to take defensive positions in declining markets. Risk is managed at the management level, where the asset allocation of the fund is to be reviewed on a regular basis and adjusted to be commensurate with the Investment Team's view on the relative attractiveness of each asset class.

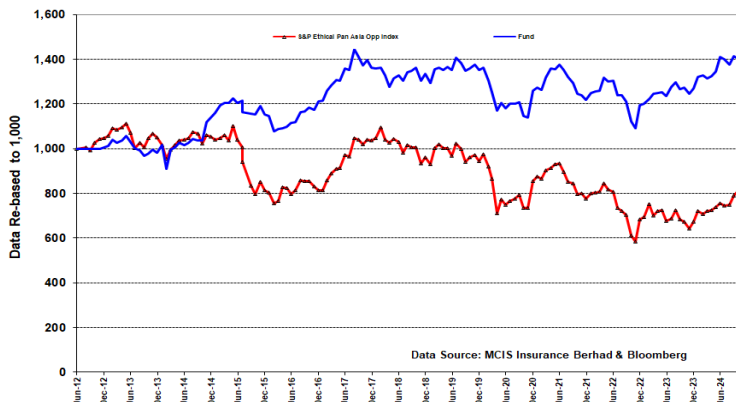

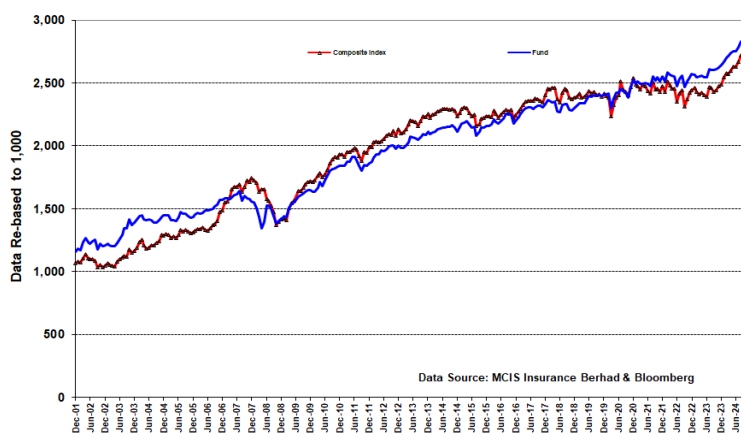

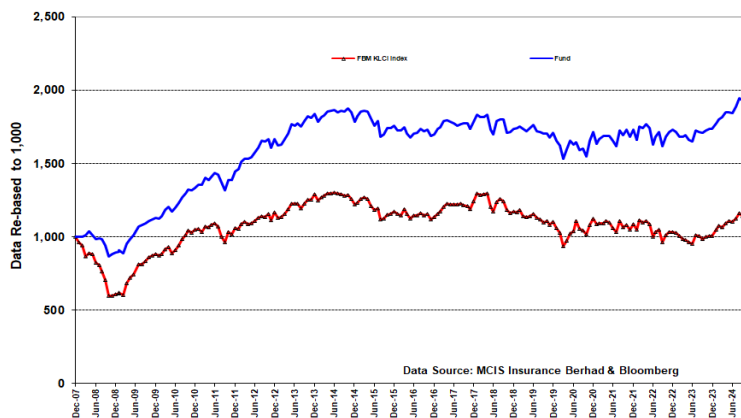

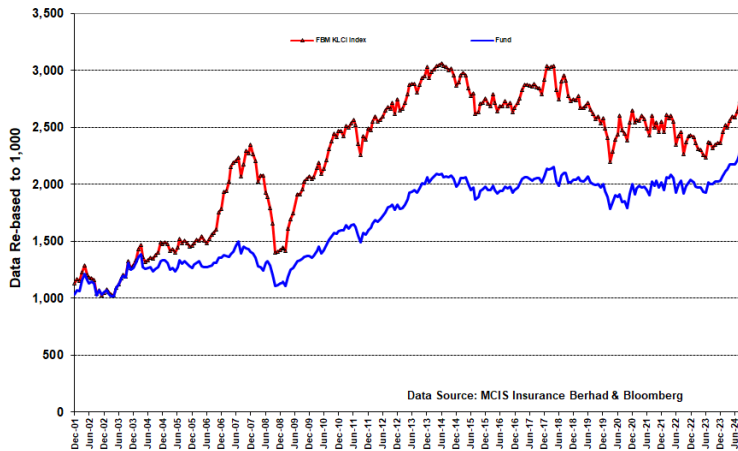

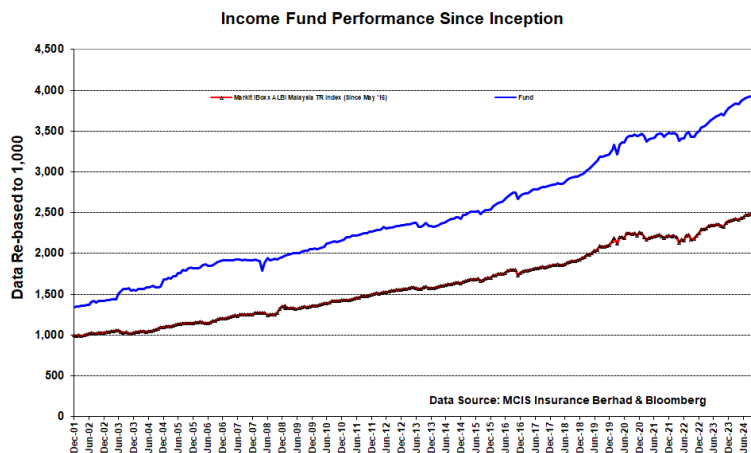

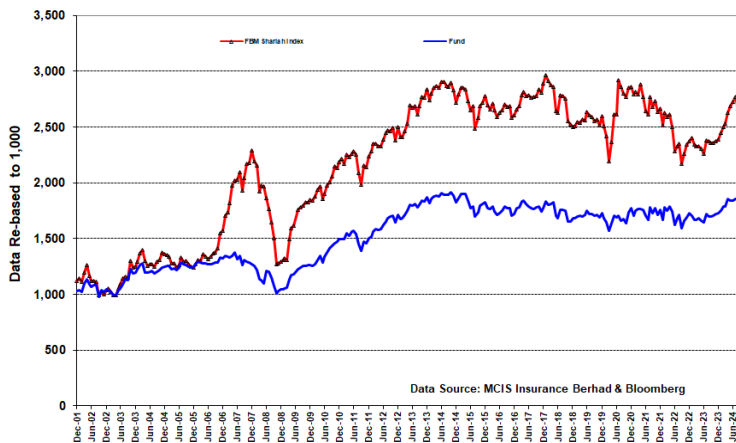

Investment Objective

The Fund invests in Eq8 Dow Jones U.S. Titans 50 ETF (“EQ8US50”) (formerly known as MyETF Dow Jones U.S. Titans 50) which aims to provide investment results that closely correspond to the performance of the Dow Jones Islamic Market U.S. Titans 50 Index. The Fund is not a Shariah-compliant product.

Investment Strategy

EQ8US50 is managed by Eq8 Capital Sdn Bhd (formerly known as i-VCAP Management Sdn Bhd) and it invests in 50 largest Shariah-compliant companies listed in the U.S. EQ8US50 is a passively managed fund.

Risks

The Fund is considered low risk given the exposure to only one underlying security with no attempt to select stocks individually or to take defensive positions in declining markets. Risk is managed at the management level, where the asset allocation of the fund is to be reviewed on a regular basis and adjusted to be commensurate with the Investment Team’s view on the relative attractiveness of each asset class.

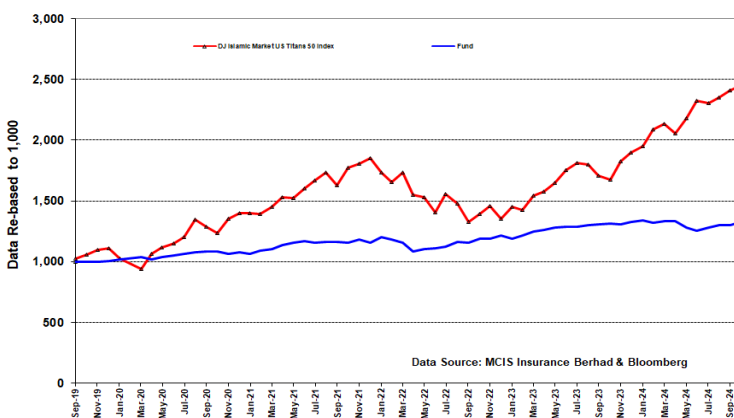

Equity Market Review and Outlook

Market Review

For the month ending October 2024, the FBMKLCI closed lower to 1,601.88 points (-2.9% MoM and +10.1% YTD). The index remained volatile in the short term given lack of catalyst, as the market reacted neutrally to the Budget 2025 announcement. The investors also hold back their position ahead of the US presidential election. The average daily trading value on Bursa fell 24.7% MoM and +26.2% YoY to RM2.5bil. Meanwhile, the average daily trading volume fell 12.6% MoM and -9.1% YoY to 2.8bil units, making it three consecutive months of decline.

Local institutions returned to being net buyers of Malaysian equities with net buy flows of RM1.8bil in October 24, after being the net sellers in the previous three months (net buy of RM4.5bil YTD). Local retail investors also returned to being net buyers of RM136.3mil in October 24 compared to their net sell flow in September 24. Foreign investors turned net sellers of Malaysian equities in October 24, with net sell flows of RM1.8bil after being the net buyers for the previous three months (net buy of RM1.8bil YTD).

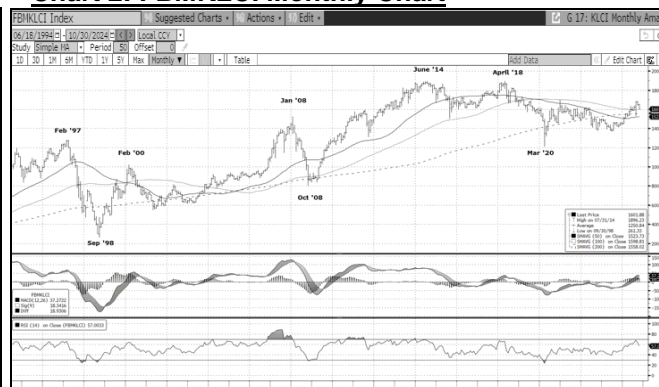
Meanwhile, global equity market performances were negative in October as the stocks paused for breath ahead of the US election and the possible effects of a policy change on inflation and interest rates. In the US, the equity market finished lower with the Dow Jones Industrial Index closed by -1.3% MoM and the broader S&P 500 index closed by -1.0% MoM. On the other hand, the European Central Bank cut interest rates by 25bps on 17th October, the third time this year, as the outlook for the bloc's economy was worsening. MSCI Europe Index closed lower by 3.3% MoM. In Asia, the performances were also mostly in negative territory with the MSCI Asia APEX 50 ex-Japan closed lower by 3.0% MoM during the month.

Market Outlook & Strategy

Traditionally, FBMKLCI Index's performance was positive in November, with an average of -0.1% and -0.4% for MoM returns over the past 10 years and 45 years, respectively. We expect the market to be supported by its attractive valuations at current levels of 1.40x as it is now below its 13-year historical average of P/B (1.86x) and 14.9x PER compared to the 13-year historical average of PER (17.0x).

Technically, the index had touched the crucial support level of 1,620 points which it could suggest a weakening of the bullish momentum and a potential shift towards consolidation or a bearish trend. MACD also indicates slowing down of the market and RSI were moving to middle point towards oversold line. However, for long term, the outlook remains positive as long as the index stays above most of its MAs. Moving forward, we expect the index will potentially extend the bullish momentum to the psychological level of 1,700 towards the end of the year, supported by policy clarity and continuity, improved earnings delivery and local currency appreciation.

We expect a positive recovery in 2024, especially for the local market, supported by improved corporate earnings and government transformation plans that should support the domestic economy. We expect BNM to maintain the OPR unchanged throughout the year 2024, due to easing inflation expectations. On the global economic review, the resilience of the US economy may lead to a soft landing, rather than recession. The tail-end of global monetary policy tightening will be positive for foreign investors to make their way back to the local stock market.

Fixed Income Review and Outlook

Market Review

Malaysia Government Securities (“MGS”) yields surged higher, in line with the increasing US Treasury yields. Brent crude oil prices rose to USD73.16/barrel as at end-Oct’24 (end-Sep’24: USD71.77/barrel), reflecting the further escalation of geopolitical tension in Middle East. Meanwhile, ringgit tumbled to RM4.3780/USD in Oct’24 (Sep’24: USD4.1235/USD).

On the local economic data, the inflation inched slightly lower to +1.8% YoY in Sep’24 (Aug’24: +1.9% YoY) on the back of easing Transport cost due to the lower global crude oil prices. Food & Beverages and Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas & Other Fuels (“HWEGOF”) inflation was unchanged at +1.6% YoY and +3.1% YoY respectively in Sep’24. Malaysia Exports were contracted to -0.3% YoY in Sep’24 (Aug’24: +12.0% YoY), brought down by the decline in Manufacturing Exports, Mining Exports and Agriculture Exports. Lower Exports in Manufacturing was mainly attributed to E&E Products and Petroleum Products. Double-digit growth in Imports eased to +10.9% YoY in Sep’24 (Aug’24: +26.2% YoY), supported by Intermediate Goods and Capital Goods. All in all, the trade surplus was widened to +RM13.2bil in Sep’24 (Aug’24: +RM5.5bil).

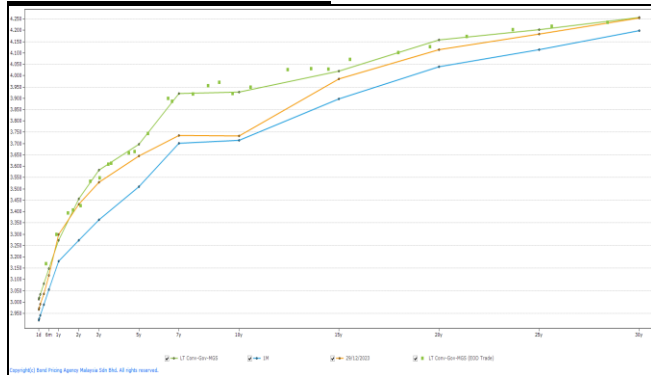
BNM international reserve declined to USD117.6billion as at end-Oct’24 (end-Sep’24: USD119.7 billion). The reserve is sufficient to finance 4.8 months of retained imports and is 0.9 time of short-term external debts.

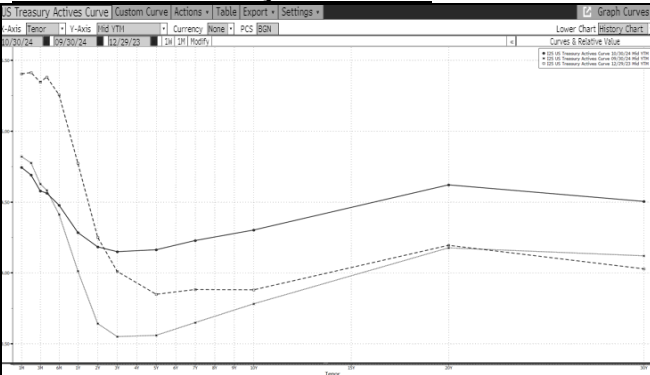

US 10-year Treasury yield jumped higher to 4.39% as at end-Oct’24 (end-Sep’24: 3.78%), reflecting the heightened geopolitical tension in the Middle East as well as the uncertainties of the upcoming US Presidential Election risk.

Market Outlook & Strategy

After a series of recent OPR hikes to pre-pandemic level, BNM is anticipated to keep its monetary policy unchanged in 2024, aiming to balance the economic growth and inflationary pressure in the country. The external risk factors such as Middle East and Russia-Ukraine geopolitical tensions will continue to weigh on the local market, but we believe corporate bond space still provides attractive yields. As such, our fixed income strategy will remain defensive to shelter from the market volatilities in the near term.
