EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

In Malaysia, the FBMKLCI delivered a relatively muted performance in May compared with regional peers as investors remained cautious amid external uncertainties and intermittent foreign fund selling. The FBMKLCI Index lost 2.3% on monthly basis, to close at 1,683.07 points. The Average daily trading value on Bursa Malaysia was up 24% MoM to RM3.8bil in May 2026. Meanwhile, the average daily trading volume on Bursa Malaysia also increased by 13.5% MoM to 3.7bn in May 2026.

Malaysia Government Securities (“MGS”) yields were mixed during the month. Brent crude oil prices declined sharply to USD92.05/barrel as at end-May'26 (end-Apr'26: USD114.01/barrel). Meanwhile, ringgit strengthened slightly against dollar to MYR3.965/USD in May'26 (Apr'26: RM3.972/USD).

On the local economic data, inflation increased to +1.9% YoY in Apr'26 (Mar'26: +1.7% YoY) on the back of +4.1% YoY increase in Transport prices as well as +1.2% YoY in Food & Beverages prices, due to the higher global commodity prices.

Moving forward, globally, the escalation of the US-Iran conflict in late February 2026 has increased volatility in global markets, including Malaysia. The FBMKLCI faced mild selling pressure as investors turned cautious amid rising geopolitical risks. However, the impact on Malaysia remains limited due to minimal direct economic exposure to the region. Locally, we continue to be positive on Malaysia's equity market in 2026, supported by strong domestic fundamentals, improving company earnings, and lower external risks, which could lead to higher market valuations. The strengthening in ringgit will also support the domestic market recovery after a volatility recorded in 2025. Any near-term market weakness could be viewed as an opportunity to accumulate equities.

For fixed income, in Malaysia, BNM is anticipated to maintain the monetary policy in 2026, given the better-than-expected GDP growth and moderate inflation data. The external risk factors such as global trade disruption, Middle East conflicts and Russia-Ukraine geopolitical tension will continue to weigh on the local market, but we believe corporate bond space still provides attractive yields. As such, our fixed income strategy will remain defensive to shelter from the market volatilities in the near term.

Based on the table below, on monthly basis, MCIS Life Income Fund, MCIS Life Dividend Fund, and MCIS Life Emerging Asia Fund outperformed the benchmark.

Policyholders are encouraged to focus on regular premiums given the current risk and volatile period of the economic and market condition. Risk-averse investors should focus on income funds due to its less volatile as compared to equity-related funds.

Investment Objective

To achieve steady stream of income and capital appreciation over the long-term (5 to 10 years of period) by investing in Principal Islamic Asia Pacific Dynamic Equity Fund ("PIAPDE").

Investment Strategy

This is a feeder fund structure that invests primarily in the PIAPDE. PIAPDE aims to achieve long-term capital appreciation and income while complying with Shariah investment criteria, through investments in the emerging and developed markets of Asia Pacific ex Japan region. 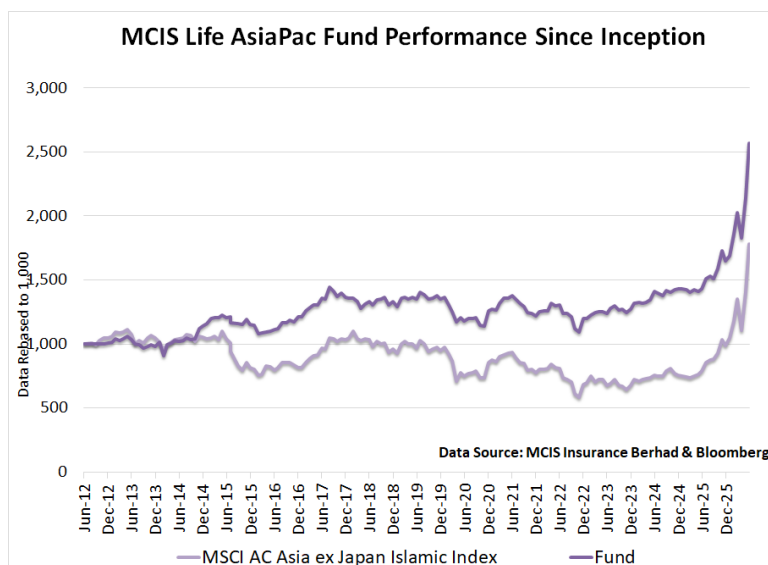

MCIS Life Global Yakin Fund Monthly Report (May 2026)

Investment Objective

To achieve capital appreciation over the long-term (5 to 10 years of period) by investing in abrdn Islamic World Equity Fund ("AIWEF"). However, the Fund is not a Shariah-compliant product.

Investment Strategy

This is a feeder fund structure that invests primarily in AIWEF (formerly known as Aberdeen Standard Islamic World Equity Fund). AIWEF invests in an international portfolio of Shariah-compliant equities and Shariah-compliant equity related securities of companies with good growth potential. The equities selection will be based on a "bottom-up" approach focused primarily on selecting high quality companies trading at attractive valuations relative to their peers using rigorous business analysis and detailed security valuation analysis. Besides AIWEF, the Fund would also invest in Shariah-compliant money market instruments.

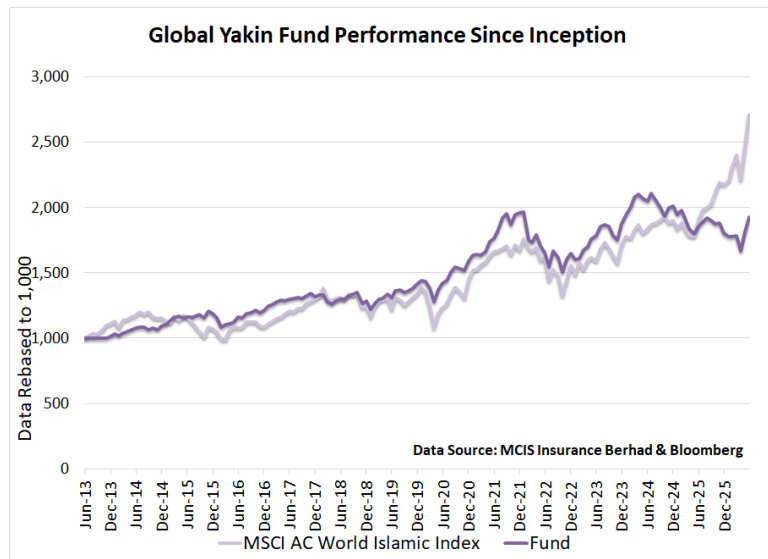

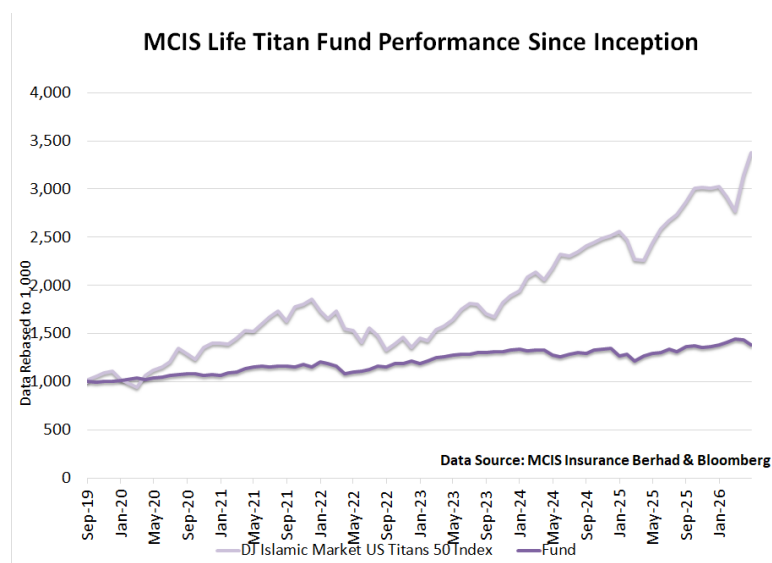

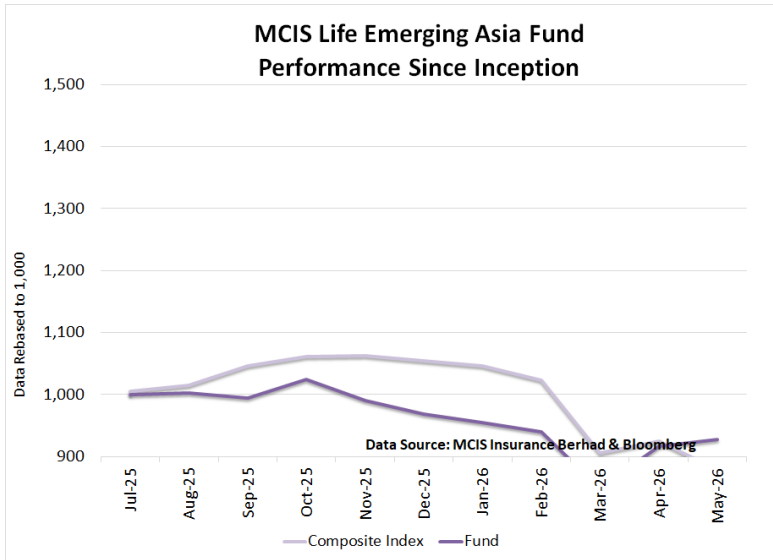

Equity Market Review and Outlook

Market Review

In Malaysia, the FBMKLCI delivered a relatively muted performance in May compared with regional peers as investors remained cautious amid external uncertainties and intermittent foreign fund selling. The FBMKLCI Index lost 2.3% on monthly basis, to close at 1,683.07 points. The Average daily trading value on Bursa Malaysia was up 24% MoM to RM3.8bil in May 2026. Meanwhile, the average daily trading volume on Bursa Malaysia also increased by 13.5% MoM to 3.7bn in May 2026.

In May 2026, local institutions continued as net buyers of Malaysian equities, with a net inflow of RM3.1bil, up from 176.4mil in the prior month. Local retail investors turned into net buyers in the month, recording a net buy of RM597mil, a reversal from the RM402.6mil net sell in April. On the other hand, foreign investors swung back to net selling in May 2026, offloading RM3.7bil, the largest monthly outflow since RM4.1bil recorded in March 2025.

Meanwhile, global equity markets extended their strong recovery in May 2026, supported by easing concerns over global growth, improving risk appetite and continued optimism surrounding AI-related investments. U.S. equities led the advance with the S&P 500 posting another month of gains of 5.1% and Dow Jones Industrial Average Index gained by 2.8% MoM. In Europe, the MSCI Europe Index gained 2.6% during the month. Across the Asia-Pacific region, market performance was generally mixed with positive bias, with gains led by technology-heavy markets such as Taiwan, South Korea and selected North Asian markets. The MSCI Asia APEX 50 ex-Japan advanced approximately 16.9% for the month.

Market Outlook & Strategy

Traditionally, FBMKLCI Index's performance was negative in June, with an average of -0.04% and -0.9% for both MoM returns over the past 10 years and 45 years, respectively. We expect the market to be supported by its attractive valuations at current levels of 14.4x PER, as it is now below its 16-year historical average of 16.8x and P/B of 1.59x, below the 16-year historical average of 1.82x.

Technically, the FBM KLCI remained within a medium-term consolidation phase throughout May. The index continued to trade above its major long-term moving averages, suggesting that the broader upward trend remains intact despite short-term volatility. Market breadth remained mixed, reflecting selective buying interest in large-cap banking, utility and telecommunications counters. Immediate resistance is seen around the 1,690-1,700 level, while key support remains at the 1,620–1,650 zone. RSI remained near neutral territory, indicating neither overbought nor oversold conditions and suggesting that the market may continue to consolidate pending stronger catalysts.

Globally, the escalation of the US-Iran conflict in late February 2026 has increased volatility in global markets, including Malaysia. The FBMKLCI faced mild selling pressure as investors turned cautious amid rising geopolitical risks. However, the impact on Malaysia remains limited due to minimal direct economic exposure to the region. Locally, we continue to be positive on Malaysia's equity market in 2026, supported by strong domestic fundamentals, improving company earnings, and lower external risks, which could lead to higher market valuations. The strengthening in ringgit will also support the domestic market recovery after a volatility recorded in 2025. Any near-term market weakness could be viewed as an opportunity to accumulate equities.

Fixed Income Review and Outlook

Market Review

Malaysia Government Securities (“MGS”) yields were mixed during the month. Brent crude oil prices declined sharply to USD92.05/barrel as at end-May'26 (end-Apr'26: USD114.01/barrel). Meanwhile, ringgit strengthened slightly against dollar to MYR3.965/USD in May'26 (Apr'26: RM3.972/USD).

On the local economic data, inflation increased to +1.9% YoY in Apr'26 (Mar'26: +1.7% YoY) on the back of +4.1% YoY increase in Transport prices as well as +1.2% YoY in Food & Beverages prices, due to the higher global commodity prices. Malaysia Exports growth surged to +36.9% YoY in Apr'26 (Mar'26: +8.4% YoY), driven by the robust Manufacturing Exports as well as the rebound in Mining Exports. Additionally, Exports to US market increased further by +39.0% YoY (Mar'26: +18.3% YoY), while Exports to ASEAN market strengthened to +31.5% YoY (Mar'26: +2.0% YoY). Meantime, Malaysia Imports accelerated by +20.0% YoY in Apr'26 (Mar'26: +10.5% YoY), supported by the expansion in Re-Exports Imports. All in all, the trade surplus widened to +MYR28.8 billion in Apr'26 (Mar'26: +MYR24.5 billion).

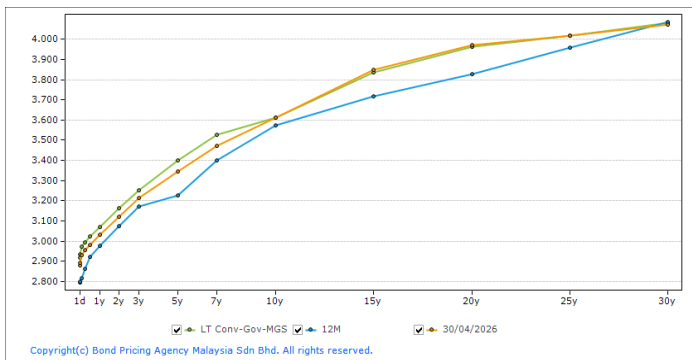
BNM international reserves improved to USD130.6 billion as at end-May'26 (end-Apr'26: USD129.7 billion). The reserves position is sufficient to finance 4.6 months of imports of goods and services and is 0.9 times of the total short-term external debt.

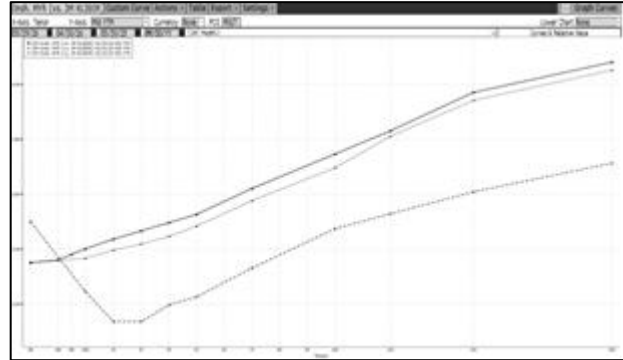

US 10-year Treasury yield increased to 4.44% as at end-May'26 (end-Apr'26: 4.37%), attributed to the volatile developments surrounding the geopolitical conflicts in Middle East.

Market Outlook & Strategy

In Malaysia, BNM is anticipated to maintain the monetary policy in 2026, given the better-than-expected GDP growth and moderate inflation data. The external risk factors such as global trade disruption, Middle East conflicts and Russia-Ukraine geopolitical tension will continue to weigh on the local market, but we believe corporate bond space still provides attractive yields. As such, our fixed income strategy will remain defensive to shelter from the market volatilities in the near term.

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
