



Investment Linked Fund Performance Report October 2018

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EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

It was another negative month for the Malaysian market as FBMKLCI fell 4.7% m-o-m to close at 1,709 points in October due to foreign selling and corrections in the US and regional markets. FBMKLCI however outperformed the FBMEMAS Index which fell by 6.1% m-o-m. Average daily value traded on Bursa Malaysia in October fell 13.7% m-o-m to RM2.15bn (the lowest since Aug 2017) as investors stayed on the sidelines in view of the volatile global markets and ahead of Malaysia's Budget 2019.

MGS yields continued to rise in October, due to the concern of higher budget deficit deriving from GST abolishment, and potentially resulting in a sovereign rating downgrade. For the same reason, Ringgit weakened to RM4.1840/USD from a month earlier at RM4.1370/USD. Brent crude oil prices fell after hitting a fresh 4-year high at USD86.01/barrel on the back of heightened geopolitical tension in Middle East, before easing back to USD75.45/barrel over the concern of Saudi journalist case.

On the local economic front, Malaysia's export growth in ringgit terms rebounded in September to grow 6.7% y-o-y, after suffering a 0.3% drop in August. This came within the consensus estimate. Nonetheless, September's export rebound remains unconvincing as momentum continues to slow.

We are cautious on the outlook of local equity market. Apart from global geopolitical tension on trade war and uncertainties, Malaysian market is also facing headwinds from weak economic data. In the coming weeks, investors are expected to see further clarity on the Government's economic and fiscal policies that should offer investors with greater confidence. We would look for bottom-fishing opportunities to accumulate quality stocks at lower levels.

For fixed income, post OPR rate hike in Jan'18, BNM is likely to maintain a neutral monetary policy for the remaining of 2018. The external risk factors will continue to weigh on the local market, but we believe corporate bond space still provides attractive yields given stable monetary stance from BNM and strong fundamentals in local market. As such, we will keep looking to buy on dips of corporate bonds if the opportunity arises.

Based on the performance table below, on monthly basis, all MCIS Investment-Linked Funds had outperformed their benchmarks return except for Dividend Fund.

Policyholders are encouraged to focus into regular premium given the current risk and volatile period of the economic and market condition. Risk adverse investors should focus into income fund due to its less volatile as compared to equity related funds.

AsiaPac Fund Monthly Report (October 2018)

Investment Objective

To achieve steady income stream with potential growth in the Asia Pacific Region over medium to long term. The aim of the Fund is to outperform the S&P Ethical Pan Asia Select Dividend Opportunities Index over periods of five or more years.

Investment Strategy

To invest in Asia Pacific Ethical Dividend Exchange Traded Fund (ETF), managed by CIMB Principal Asset Management where the ETF is listed on the Singapore Stock Exchange.

The ETF focuses on top 40 ethical and high yielding stocks in the Asia Pacific Region excluding India, Taiwan, Japan, New Zealand and Philippines. The fund provides country diversification across the industry that is traded in US Dollar.

Risks

The Fund is considered low risk given the exposure to only one underlying securities with no attempt to select stocks individually or to take defensive positions in declining markets. Risk is managed at the management level, where the asset allocation of the fund to be reviewed on regular basis, and adjusted to commensurate with the Investment Team view on the relative attractiveness of each asset class.













Equity Market Review and Outlook


Market Review

It was another negative month for the Malaysian market as FBMKLCI fell 4.7% m-o-m to close at 1,709 points in October due to foreign selling and corrections in the US and regional markets. FBMKLCI however outperformed the FBMEMAS Index which fell by 6.1% m-o-m. Average daily value traded on Bursa Malaysia in October fell 13.7% m-o-m to RM2.15bn (the lowest since Aug 2017) as investors stayed on the sidelines in view of the volatile global markets and ahead of Malaysia's Budget 2019.

On the local economic front, Malaysia's export growth in ringgit terms rebounded in September to grow 6.7% y-o-y, after suffering a 0.3% drop in August. This came within the consensus estimate. Nonetheless, September's export rebound remains unconvincing as momentum continues to slow. Meanwhile foreign investors net sold RM1.5bn worth of Malaysian equities in October, making it seven months of foreign exit for this year. October's net sell lifted 2018 YTD foreign net sell to RM10.2bn which reversed 96% of the RM10.6bn of foreign net buy in 2017.

Globally, the International Monetary Fund ("IMF") cuts its global growth forecasts as trade tensions between the U.S. and trading partners have started to hurt economic activity worldwide. The IMF says the global economy is now expected to grow at 3.7% this year and next year — down 0.2pps from an earlier forecast, according to the fund's latest World Economic Outlook report.

Market Outlook & Strategy

Technically, correction in the month of October was quite rough in line with the sluggish global market. The overall sentiment was dampened by the US-China trade war and global monetary tightening. The market is weak and a reversal to the downside is taking place as the local bourse has entered into the final phase of large 10-10.5-year cycle. The index is currently forming a Head & Shoulder formation. A break below the neckline of 1,650 will be very negative for the market. The downside risk is still limited within major support at 1,658.

Historically, the performance of the FBMKLCI in November has been negative, registering average monthly negative returns of 1.1% over the past 10 years. In the mean time, investors are likely to get an update on ongoing US-China trade tensions and ECB meeting on 25th October 2018.

We are cautious on the outlook of local equity market. Apart from global geopolitical tension on trade war and uncertainties, Malaysian market is also facing headwinds from weak economic data. GDP growth is expected to ease in 2H18, dragged by slowing exports, investments and public spending, although domestic demand should stay resilient. In the coming weeks, investors are expected to see further clarity on the Government's economic and fiscal policies that should offer investors with greater confidence. We would look for bottom-fishing opportunities to accumulate quality stocks at lower levels.

Fixed Income Review and Outlook

Market Review

Malaysia Government Securities (“MGS”) yields continued to rise in October, due to the concern of higher budget deficit deriving from GST abolishment, and potentially resulting in a sovereign rating downgrade. For the same reason, Ringgit weakened to RM4.1840/USD from a month earlier at RM4.1370/USD. Brent crude oil prices fell after hitting a fresh 4-year high at USD86.01/barrel on the back of heightened geopolitical tension in Middle East, before easing back to USD75.45/barrel over the concern of Saudi journalist case.


On local economic data, Malaysia’s CPI remained below 1% for the fourth consecutive months, being at +0.3% in September’18, regardless to the implementation of new SST. Malaysia’s export growth pared down in August to -0.3% (Jul’18: +9.4%) due to the slowdown in manufacturing sector, especially after the front loading effect ahead of the US-China trade tension. The drop in commodity prices also dampened the export figures, mainly from palm oil and LNG products. Import growth on the other hand supported at +11.2% (Jul’18: +10.3%), largely driven by the purchases in the final month of 0%-GST in August. All in all, trade surplus was seen slightly lower at +RM1.6bil in August (Jul’18: +RM8.3bil).

External reserve reduced to USD102.8bil in mid-October (mid-Sep’18: USD103.9bil), as a result of continued capital outflow from local market. The reserve is sufficient to cover 7.4 months of retained import and 0.9 times short term external debt, which is lower than the 1 time of short term external debt as per IMF recommendation.



The 10-year US Treasury yield hit a 7-year high at 3.23% in October after the US unemployment rate dropped to 3.7%, a level not seen in nearly 50 years. Coupled with higher inflation data, the investors are pricing-in the expectation of a Fed rate hike in December and another 3 rate hikes in 2019.

Market Outlook & Strategy

Post OPR rate hike in Jan’18, BNM is likely to maintain a neutral monetary policy for the remaining of 2018 despite the major central banks are still showing signal towards policy tightening. The external risk factors such as geopolitical tension in the Middle-East, US-China trade war and fluctuation in crude oil prices will continue to weigh on the local market, but we believe corporate bond space still provides attractive yields given stable monetary stance from BNM and strong fundamentals in local market. As such, we will keep looking to buy on dips of corporate bonds if the opportunity arises.
